Last week Superintendent Dr. Nikki Woodson proudly announced that after several years of very hard work by the faculty and administrators, ALL seven elementary schools have been officially authorized to be **International Baccalaureate World Schools**. This initiative is transforming the teaching and learning in WT schools and sets the District apart from every other school district in the State of Indiana. We are one of only a handful of public school districts in the country that have achieved this status. BIG news for WT schools!

MILLION DOLLAR CAMPAIGN GOING STRONG

Now co-chaired by **Perry Griffith** and **Dave Carter**, parents in the District and products of Washington Township Schools, to date over \$800,000 has been raised to support all the students in the District.

A **BIG THANK YOU** to hundreds and hundreds of donors including teachers, staff, parent and community members, who have helped to make half of this commitment possible to allow the Foundation to gift and pledge a total of \$400,000. Allocated out of the WTSF Annual Fund, this amount largely fulfills the 35% of the grant budget policy to underwrite WT Professional Development for faculty.

The other \$400,000 is thanks to very generous support of over 30 other committed teachers, staff, parents and community members who have given or pledged gifts from \$1000 to \$150,000. A donor plaque will be displayed in the main hallway at the H. Dean Evans Community & Education Center.


