Daily Schedule

8:15 am - 3:25 pm

If you are dropping your child off in the morning, please be mindful of the usually lengthy morning traffic and drop off lines. Parents please encourage your students to ride the bus to school.

Parents can begin dropping off students at 8:05 a.m. and only once a staff member is out front to monitor car drop-off.

Students must be in their classrooms by 8:25 a.m. Should your child be late/tardy or returning from an appointment, you must park and escort them into the building to sign them in at the front office.

In an effort to keep our children and our school safe, you will be required to show a valid picture ID any time you pick up a student from school.



PARENTS

Please help us by encouraging your students to ride the bus to school.

Our morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up are extremely congested.

Transportation

Your bus assignment information will be available on Skyward before school begins. Students enrolling after the start of school can expect to hear directly from transportation within 2-5 business days.

All students should board their bus at their assigned stop each day. If you move during the school year, please contact the office to make permanent changes to your transportation.

Limited Choice/Non-Resident students' transportation is the parent responsibility. Two weeks after school begins, you may contact the school to see if there is a bus stop available near your home. Parents are responsible to transport student's to/from the nearest bus stop.

Car pick-up students will be stationed at the front of the building. Once the parent/guardian is at the front of the building, AV staff will escort students to each car. Please do not park and come into the building at dismissal.

All students must be picked-up by 3:25 p.m. or arrangements need to be made with AYS.

Unfortunately, for the safety of your student, we <u>cannot</u> accept transportation changes over the phone, by email, or by fax. Please make sure you communicate any changes with a written note to avoid any confusion at dismissal. Unless we receive written notice from the parent/guardian, your student will be sent home on their assigned bus.

Students without a written note will be sent home on their regular bus, without exception.

Attendance

Absence is defined as a student missing all or any portion of the school day, for any reason. There are three types of absences: Excused, Unexcused, and Prearranged.

Should your student be absent for any reason, please call the attendance line at (317)259-8864 before 9:00 am.

If your student is arriving late or leaving early for an appointment, please request a note from the dentist, doctor, etc. All notes should be given to the front office for recordkeeping. Offices may also fax notes to (317)576–5255.

Excused Absence (including being tardy)

- Death in the immediate family.
- Major religious holiday.
- Medical, dental, court or other required appointment. Must provide a signed statement from doctor, dentist, etc. upon return to school.
- Personal illness/injury. Please call the attendance line 317-259-8864 each
 day the student is absent. A written medical verification from a
 physician/clinic must be provided upon the student's return to school after
 5 consecutive days of absence due to illness.
- A written medical verification from a physician/clinic must be provided for each additional absence once 10 days of absence (whether excused or unexcused) have been accumulated.

<u>Unexcused Absence</u> (including being tardy or leaving prior to dismissal)

Absences for any reasons other than those mentioned above and/or not verified as required are considered unexcused. Missing the bus, etc., is unexcused.

Prearranged Absence

A prearranged absence request will not be approved if any one of the following occurs:

- It is the final week of any grading period.
- It is the week preceding or the week following a recess period.
- It is during required testing.
- The student has excessive absences.
- The student's grade point average is below a 2.0 or C.

Prearranged absence forms are available at the office.

AYS After School Care

At Your School Child Services, AYS, provides childcare at Allisonville from 6:30 a.m. - 8:25 a.m. and from 3:25 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. You may register your student at the AYS central office all summer long. They are located at 4755 Kingsway Drive, Suite 300, 46205 or you can phone them at 283-3817. The AYS program does reach capacity quickly, so we encourage you to register as soon as possible. Please call before 9:00 am when your student will be absent for any reason.

From the Nurse

When to Stay Home. Please keep your student at home if their temperature is at or above 100 degrees. Additionally, your student must be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school.

Life-Threatening Allergies must be reported to the nurse prior to student enrollment. Appropriate medications must be received before the student may attend class.

Medication at School. Parents must bring in student medication, in person, for the nurse to administer.

Students may never transport medication to school.

Questions? The school office will be open Monday – Friday from 9 am – noon and 1 pm – 3 pm beginning July 18, 2016.

Parents/guardians are responsible for all cafeteria expenses in advance. All payments may be made by cash, check or money order to the cafeteria. Please make all checks payable to Allisonville Elementary School. Online payments can be made at www.MyPaymentsPlus.com for your convenience. You may pay by the month, nine—week period, semester, or year if you prefer, but daily lunch payments are strongly discouraged. Please note that the State Board of Accounts does not allow the charging of meals. All meals must be paid in advance. If a check is returned to the school for nonpayment from the bank, an additional charge of \$20.00 will be added and you must send cash or money order to cover the cost.

It is not necessary to have a background check to visit your student for lunch. Visitors simply sign in at the office as a visitor and join their student as they enter the lunchroom.

NOTE: Parents visiting their student for lunch may bring outside food, but due to allergies, please no sharing with classmates.
