## Reading at Allisonville

Mrs. Weiger, our Media Specialist, emphasizes the slogan "You model what you preach.". At Allisonville, we preach how important it is to read! Our last Friday Focus, Mrs. Reffett shared her favorite book with all 725 Allisonville students. It took about 5 minutes and all the students gave her full attention and were engaged by the book. She had the characters come to life and students were excited about the next page. There was a video of Mrs. Bobb and she introduced baby Collin to the students. He was 4 weeks old and she read his favorite book to the students. They listened intently and were captivated. This process is called read aloud. Reading to our children helps learn vocabulary, comprehension and helps improve information processing skills.

This summer I attended a reading conference and 20 educators were selected from the group to participate in a demonstration. Depending on the questions, we had to take one or two steps forward if you answered some and take steps backward if you answered no to others. Participants had to be 30 years or older as they did not want technology to be a factor. Some of the questions were:

- Did you have a parent that felt reading was important and encouraged it?
- Did you have teachers that encouraged reading?
- Did you have teachers who used read aloud?
- Did you always have plenty to eat?
- Did you have access to plenty of books?
- Did you have a library card?
- Did you have a safe and stable place to read?

I was surprised that at the end of the exercise I was in front! I was a farm boy and my family had little disposable income, and I never saw my dad read a book. I did have a mom and grandfather who loved to read and they made sure I had access to books. I am also thankful for the way I was raised.

Kathleen Ferguson, (our Literacy Specialist), has a vision to find homes for all our extra books as we prepare to move. We started last Thursday night at our Literacy Night and continued all day on Friday. Allisonville gave away close to 30,000 books to our students and community. We believe students will read if they have the books! We had a blast with this project and want every student at Allisonville to have books to read.

  - 4. "What other ways can we show that?"



## What's Happening in the Media Center?



First and second graders are learning about The Young Hoosier Book Award nominees and will be able to vote for their favorite book. These students have also been working on how to "browse" books in order to find a "just right" book for themselves. We previewed a lot of book by playing Musical Books. Ask your child about it.

Third graders have been learning about how a library is organized and how to use the catalog to find a book. We are now moving into learning about poetry. We'll be exploring characters, context clues, stanzas, and making meaning.

Fourth graders have been learning about how organisms have structures that they use to help them survive. We've inquired into some pictures and asked questions. Now we are spending time learning how to find our answers and cite the source we used. Did you know that websites often end with .gov, .org, .edu, and .net? Do you know what each means?

Fifth graders have started learning about the Global Goals for Sustainable Development. They are exploring different issues and problems around the world in order to discover their passions. We need to be aware and make others aware of these Global Goals so that by the time these 5th graders are in their 20s, many of the problems will be solved. Ask your child or go to https://www.globalgoals.org/ to learn more.

Mrs. Weiger and Mrs. Roth are preparing for inventory. We'll need some volunteers to help us scan EVERY single book in the media center over a 2 day period. If you might be able to help during the week of March 18-22, please email Mrs. Weiger at pweiger@ msdwt.k12.in. us.
